Dear Mr. Corbett:

This letter authorizes you to make use of the following statement or other statements of substantially the same content in the promotion of your Nutone Radio Chimes. *er*

"In addition to using the Nutone radio chime for dinner table signals, you may wish to duplicate in your home the most famous sound which comes out of your radio today — the tones of NBC chimes. By tapping numbers 1, 3 and 2 (shown on the reeds of the Nutone dinner table chime) you will exactly duplicate the famous NBC chime tones."

We request, however, that any re-wording of the above statement be submitted to us for approval.

This consent is given on condition that all chimes which are sold by you and which you represent to be a duplication of the NBC chimes shall be satisfactory to us as a duplication of the tone of our chimes. This consent is also given on the express understanding that no rights are included under which any radio station may broadcast our chimes.

It is also understood that you will make no representations directly or indirectly to the effect that NBC is in any way associated with the manufacture or sale of these chimes.
